SUBSTANTIVE CHANGES IN PROPOSED REVISIONS OF BYLAWS AND ARTICLES OF ASSOCIATION

	Current	Proposed
Purpose (Bylaw Preamble, Article 3A)	In Articles (nothing in Bylaws): "... to educate the general public in their interest and knowledge of Jungian psychology."	"Promotes an interest in and understanding of Jungian Psychology through the presentation of events such as lectures, workshops and conferences open to members and the general public. The association also cultivates a collegial environment in which participants can experience personal development and growth."
Senior Representative (Bylaw 2A)	Includes the position of Senior Representative, held automatically by the immediate past President, unless that person declines, in which case the position is open for election.	Eliminates the position of Senior Representative and substitutes the position of Past President, held automatically by the person who was the immediate past President, unless that person declines, in which case the position remains vacant.
Corresponding Secretary (Bylaw 2A and 4E)	Includes positions of both Corresponding Secretary and Secretary (and elsewhere makes reference to a Recording Secretary).	Eliminates Corresponding Secretary, leaving just Secretary, who records the proceedings of the meetings and carries on correspondence pertaining to the association.
Deadline for Nomination of Officers (Bylaw 2C)	"On or before January 15 th of each year"	"By the last meeting of the calendar year"
Term of Service of Board Members (Bylaw 2D)	Terms commence the first day of the following September.	Terms commence the first day of the fiscal year (July 1st) following the election.
Quorum of Board (Bylaw 3C)	Five members of the board for the purpose of voting.	A majority of the members of the governing board.
Named Officers (Bylaw 4)	President, Vice President, Secretary, Corresponding Secretary, Treasurer, Senior Representative, Member at Large, Program Chair, Communications Chair, Library Chair, Membership Chair, Social Chair.	President, Vice President, Treasurer, Secretary, Past President, Program Officer, Event Coordinator, Communications Officer, Webmaster, Librarian, Media Archivist, Membership Officer, Database Administrator, Hospitality Officer, Members-at-Large

	Current	Proposed
Classes of Membership (Bylaw 5, Article 5A)	2 classes: general and honorary; no give criteria for "honorary."	3 classes: general, emeritus, and honorary. Emeritus: "lifetime emeritus membership to a longstanding senior member with a record of extraordinary service to the governing board and the association... eligible to vote and to hold office but.. exempt from annual dues." Honorary: "membership of a specified duration to a non-member who has made a significant contribution to the association... non-voting... exempt from annual dues... not.. eligible to hold an office"
Dues (Bylaw 6)	If dues not paid by December 1 st , membership is terminated.	If dues not paid by September 1 st , membership is terminated.
Annual Meeting Date (Bylaw 7A)	In the month of May	At the final program of the fiscal year.
Quorum for Club Meetings (Bylaw 7C)	A majority of the members, or twenty members, whichever is less.	The members present
Amending the ByLaws (Bylaw 8, Article 8)	By affirmative vote of a majority of the members voting at any regular or special meeting.	"Proposals to amend the bylaws must first be approved by the governing board before being presented to the members of the association for a vote. The bylaws may then be amended by affirmative vote of a majority of the members present at an annual or special meeting..."
Dissolution (Bylaw 9)	By the vote of a two thirds majority of the active members	By the vote of a two thirds majority of the members of the governing board.
